Directors and Conflicts of Duty

Dr Rosemary Teele Langford is a Senior Lecturer with the Melbourne Law School, University of Melbourne, where she teaches a wide range of subjects including Corporations Law and Corporate Governance and Directors' Duties. Rosemary has significant expertise in the area of directors' duties and has been publishing extensively on this topic since 1994.

Her first book, *Directors' Duties: Principles and Application*, was published by Federation Press in 2014 and she is currently completing a 200,000-word comparative monograph with Oxford University Press (UK), entitled *Company Directors and Conflicts of Interest*. The book provides detailed coverage of the general law and statutory duties in the UK, with comparative material primarily from Australia and Canada but also incorporating insights from New Zealand and Hong Kong.

Rosemary edits the directors' duties section of the *Company & Securities Law Journal* and is an active member of the Corporations Committee of the Business Law Section of the Law Council of Australia.
